Worship Club

This half-term Reverend Ruthi has started a Worship Club, this runs every Tuesday lunch time. 16 children from Years 4—6 have joined and they represent all the children in school. During this club the children discuss, help plan and evaluate worship; they also lead worship (assembly) once per half-term for the whole school, planning and presenting

based on one of our school worship themes (being thankful, responsible, honest, polite, independent, kind) or an event from the Christian Calendar.

The children are thoroughly enjoying this club and are looking

forward to running their first assembly next term.

What's been happening this half-term?

It's been a short half-term which has flown by! However, it hasn't stopped all classes throwing themselves into their new learning and new

topics! In the **EYFS** the kids have been making music, experimenting with different instruments and getting the opportunity to make their own, they used these for their own musical performance! In **Year 1/2** the children have been learning about the 7 continents and 5 oceans in geography, in art they have been creating their own 'Hebden Bridge in the snow' pictures, inspired by Hunters in the Snow. **Year 3/4** have enjoyed tucking into their new topic in history: Stone Age to Iron Age, they tried making

their own Stone Age flatbread; The Stone Age bread-makers took flour made from wild wheat and barley, mixed it with water, and then baked it on hot stone slabs (we used an oven!) apparently it was delicious!

Year 5/6 have been on two, yes two, trips this half-term! They spent the day at Leeds Art Gallery where they took part in a workshop, making their own sketchbooks and becoming art detectives. This week, off they went to York to spend the day at The Jorvik Centre for their history work on The Vikings. They engaged in a battle tactics workshop using real axes and swords for role-play, this was a tad stressful for Mr. Robinson and Mrs. Hulme to witness! All in all a fantastic half-term of learning and new experiences!
