The children are going to have a go at finding wood and build a criss cross style fire. - <u>Thinking about the longer nights and shorter days.</u> – the children are going to melt wax on the fire to pour into the ground, making earth candles. - <u>Planning and digging a pond-</u> the children are going to find the perfect area to dig and develop a pond. Thinking about the different wildlife that it might attract 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Creating a natural shelter</u> – working on teamwork and communication skills to build a shelter that can stay up all the time. The children are to forage for natural resources to make a weather proof shelter. - <u>Stick poppies-</u> thinking about Remembrance Day, and making a poppy in a “gods eye” way. Wrapping wool around sticks. - <u>Planning and digging a pond-</u> the children are going to find the perfect area to dig and develop a pond. Looking at what the trees need to survive. Finding out what kinds of trees they are. - <u>Planning and digging a pond-</u> the children are going to find the perfect area to dig and develop a pond. Thinking about the different wildlife that it might attract - <u>Fungi hunt-</u> looking for fungi and identifying them with information books. Matching the details to the description.

<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Building a wood shelter</u>- using the tools and thinking about how we made our natural shelter, the children are going to have a go at making a small scale shelter for wood. - <u>Collecting wood for future fires</u>- the children are going to find wood to store in the hand made wood shelter. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Wild animals</u>-Thinking about the different wild animals that might access the site. Looking for clues/ foot prints and poo. - <u>Setting up a foot print trap</u>- an area to capture the foot print of the wild animals that might access the site and identifying the prints. - <u>Making bird feeders</u>- mixing different seeds to entice different birds to use the site. Thinking about keeping the birds well fed throughout winter. 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Fire lighting</u> – practicing using a flint and steel to light a fire. Working on technique and resilience. - <u>Wild cooking</u>- cooking on a camp fire, practicing safety and following instructions. - 	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> - <u>Building a wooden Christmas tree</u> – using the tools the children are going to make a Christmas tree using hammers and nails. Using the wood found around or wood cut previously. - <u>Christmas decorations</u> – getting creative and making tree decorations from natural resources.
