Slack line-Building up our core strength by balancing on two ropes. The children are going to challenge themselves to climb from one end to the other. 	 Bug hunt- The children are going to go on a bug hunt and see if they can match the bugs to the ones in the information books. The children are going to count their legs and use jam jars to carefully catch them and observe the bugs. Filling up the bug hotel- the children are going to search around for tree debris, moss, wood and other things to fill up our bug hotel.
